MUSEUM OF HUMAN MIGRATION FEASIBILITY STUDY FOR PORT KEMBLA AREA

From the earliest days of the constitution of the Migration Heritage Project the concept of a museum highlighting migration to the Illawarra has always been a vision for this group. In fact, in the early days and before incorporation, the cultural communities, museums and historical groups that met were known collectively as the "Museum Working Party" before becoming the Migration Heritage Project (MHP). Over the years the MHP has led and participated in many discussions and meetings to realise the goal of a migration museum in the Illawarra region, while at the same time researching and building a collection of stories that showcase the rich and diverse histories of Illawarra migrant communities.

Late 2018, Chris Lacey from the Multicultural Communities Council of Illawarra (MCCI) and Franca Facci, the Chair of the Migration Heritage Project (MHP), collaborated to prepare a joint submission to the NSW Government's Port Kembla Community Investment for a feasibility study to establish a Museum of Human Migration to the Illawarra. One of the primary objectives cited in the application for establishing the museum was "to showcase and celebrate human migration to the region as a central narrative of the Illawarra's economic, social and civic success as a highly diverse multicultural community".

The application was successful and funding has been obtained to conduct a feasibility study. John Petersen has been contracted to undertake the feasibility study for MCCI/MHP. The feasibility study, within the Port Kembla 2505 area, is to be delivered by 31 December 2019.

OPENING OF ITALO WING AT MACI

Memoir of benfactor, Italo Mazzola, AM, researched and written by MHP for official opening

Congratulations to Multicultural Aged Care Illawarra (MACI) on the opening of the new function centre and 10 bed memory support unit named after late Italo Mazzola, AM, whose generous bequest allowed the construction of the Italo Wing. The Migration Heritage Project were commissioned by MACI to produce a memoir of Italo which was made available at the official opening on 1 March 2019. Franca Facci, Chair of the Migration Heritage Project, was one of the invited guest speakers at the opening (pictured above right). The memoir of the Italo Mazzola was researched, written and designed by the Migration Heritage Project Committee members who were very grateful for the opportunity to produce the memoir about a very generous man. Italo Mazzola migrated to Australia in 1959 and settled in Wollongong. Through hard work and some good fortune, he was able to build a local small business in Addison Avenue Lake Illawarra which he eventually sold, gained a University education and began to build his wealth. He was an active member of the Italian communities, particularly the Marchigiani, not only in Wollongong but in NSW generally. Through his bequests both during his lifetime and after his death many organisations have benefited
